AIMS AND IDEALS

HVB Academy is an English medium co-education school run by the Society "Hindi Vidya Bhavan". The aim of the school is to promote a cosmopolitan atmosphere, to train children of all denominations providing for them a liberal education, founding its edifice on Indian culture.

Instruction imparted in this institution helps the development of the head and the heart of the child as also his aesthetic appreciation. The school wishes to develop each pupil to the limit of his capacity so that he may make the most of himself and contribute the greatest good to society. Citizenship, character, service and loyalty-knowledge, skills, attitudes and appreciation - are the goals. With 90 to 95% of our school students securing first classes/distinctions and ten to fifteen of them getting into the merit list at the Board Examinations, standing within the first fifty, the school is committed to improving its results and expects the parents too, to fully co-operate and involve themselves in the matter of coaching and helping them.

THE CURRICULUM

The school runs classes from Std. V to Std. X following ICSE curriculum. The pupils at the end of their school career, qualify for the Indian School Certificate Examination. The medium of instruction throughout the school is English. Options are offered in the languages and other academic groups to suit the child's individuality and capacity.

Languages

Marathi is the regional language offered as a third language for all pupils for four Years. Hindi and English are compulsory from Std. V to X.

Community Living - Environmental Studies - Social Studies

This branch of knowledge is compulsory throughout the school.

Mathematics

Mathematics is a compulsory subject.

Science

Science from Std. VIII to X will comprise of Physics, Chemistry and Biology. The study of these is planned in such a way as to provide due facility for objective and scientific thinking for which there are three well equipped science Laboratories.

Computer Studies

The school has introduced Computer Studies as a compulsory subject for the pupils of Nursery to Std. VIII and optional for Std. IX & X. The school has, therefore, invested in up-to-date, air-conditioned Computer Laboratory and provided Interactive Promethean board & Projectors along with computer having the latest configuration in every classroom for a hands-on experience to the pupils and to encourage computer-aided-learning in all the Pre-primary, Primary and Secondary classes.

Value Education/Moral Science

Great stress is laid on moral instruction and ethical values.

The Arts

To enable the pupils to express their innermost feelings the curriculum includes Child Art, Drawing, Painting, Art Appreciation, Craft, Music and Dance.

Our children fare very well in Art, and receive several inter-school and international prizes.

To encourage talented pupils, the school sends pupils for the Government Art Examinations.

General Knowledge

Sensitivity to changes in society and to happenings around the world is developed in the students.

Physical Education

With a view in keeping the child healthy and fit, special attention is paid to sports, physical culture and games - indoor and outdoor - including cricket, badminton, table tennis, throw-ball, foot-ball, weight-lifting, Skating & Swimming, Hockey, Boxing, Gymnastics, etc.

Physical Education & martial art is a compulsory examination subject.

Educational field trip

Social Service/Educational Camps

HVB encourages the students to participate in Camp and excursions. It is an integral part of the educational system as these outings definitely add to the students experiential learnings.

SUPW AND COMMUNITY SERVICE

The principles of charity and humanitarianism are fostered in the child from an early age. The pupils provide services national and social organisation like the National Association for the Blind, the Social Education Committee, ex-servicemen's organisations, UNICEF, Cancer Patients Aid Association etc. They often voluntarily visit the hospitals, the aged, the handicapped, child welfare centres, etc., with gifts and donations. Annual camps are compulsory. Unique school projects "Ujjwal Bhavishya" and "Help Us Help Them" are also included for community service.

HVB aims at training the pupils in physical fitness, hygiene, sanitation first aid, ethical values, character building and national integration. Traffic regulations and elementary criminology and the country's internal security are also included.

It is important to note that it is necessary and compulsory to get at least a C grade in each of Computer Studies, Physical Education and Scouting/SUPW, besides passing in the regular academic subjects of the ICSE, class, otherwise the candidate's X results are withheld by the Council.

External Examinations

The students are sent for external examinations in Hindi, Marathi, Mathematics and Art. We have enrolled our school in the UN, United/Schools Organisation from this year for our students from Std. V to Std. IX for participating in the UN, UNESCO and UN, GK All India Test. Science and Mathematics Olympiad, Cyber Olympiad, II PM & NTS Examination.

The Interact Club

Our Interact Club is under the wing of the Rotary Club of Bombay District 3140. It provides opportunities for the self-development of the students enabling them to interact with interactors from other schools and moulds and shapes them as tomorrow's leaders. CSA awareness programme is conducted for Std. VI th

The Interactors strive to serve the community by holding blood donation camps and contributing to other causes, monetarily and giving a part of their own selves and their time.

Road Safety Patrol Group

The Road Safety Patrol is organised to help our children to learn and obey traffic rules. The RSP group also helps in the smooth flow of vehicles at the entrance of the school at its meeting and dispersal times.

THE LIBRARY

Parents and children can view the availability of books through website and the School's well-stocked and well-furnished Library. It provides ample reading facilities to develop the study habits of the pupils. Students have direct access to the Library. Attention is paid to develop speed and comprehension in reading.

Rules:

- 1. Silence is to be maintained in the Library and conversation is strictly prohibited.
- 2. Books are available only when the Librarian is on duty.
- 3. One to two books shall be issued at a time to pupils for home reading. Books should be returned within fourteen days from the date of issue. The school staff members are entitled to five text-books and five other books for the duration of the term. Extra books issued in their names must be returned within seven days.
- 4. Readers shall not write upon, damage, tear, turn down the leaves of, or make any mark upon any book, manuscript or map belonging to the Library nor shall they lay the paper on which they are writing upon any book, manuscript or map. The erasure of any mark or any writing in a book, manuscript or map belonging to the Library is strictly prohibited. It is requested that any reader observing a defect in, or damage to, any book or manuscript shall point out the same to the Librarian.
- 5. Every person taking a book out of the Library and every reader inside the Library shall be responsible for the safe custody of the book and its return and in the event of it being lost or damaged (including pencil or ink marks), shall either replace the book or pay such compensation as may be fixed by the Librarian with the consent and approval of the Principal.
- 6. Encyclopedia, meant exclusively for use in the Library, shall not be issued for home reading.
 - No book forming a part of the reference collection nor a periodical shall ordinarily be issued out, unless the consent of the Principal has been obtained for overnight reading.
- 7. All books must be returned to the Library for stock-taking before the Annual Examination.
- 8. No hand-bags or bags are allowed in the Library.
- 9. The Library hours are **8.00 a.m. to 5.30 p.m.** On non working Saturdays and during vacations, the Library shall function between 8.30 a.m. to 1.30 p.m.

AUDIO-VISUAL EDUCATION

To make education more interesting and meaningful to the child, the school is equipped with audio-visual aids-both projected and non-projected. With this in view, audio-visual education forms an integral part of the school's programme with films, slides, charts and models supplementing school tours, excursions and visits to places of educational and historical importance in, around and out of Bombay. Excursions for the study of natural - plant, sea, bird, animal and insect-life are arranged from time to time to enable the students to get a first hand knowledge of the world around them.

The school bus is used for most of these excursions and every class has ample opportunity to participate in them.

THE HOUSE SYSTEM

To foster in the students a sense of collective responsibility and solidarity, a feeling of sociability and unity, the school has the House System. The Secondary students are divided into the Alpha House, the Beta House, the Gamma House & the Delta House. Each of these Houses has its office-bearers: the Captain, the Vice-Captain, two Games Captains and two Secretaries.

There is also a Prefects' Body that helps to maintain House and class discipline. The President and Vice Captains, under the guidance of the Principal, are in charge of this Council, planning, galvanising and organising its moves.

THE SCHOOL BAND

HVB school band is for the benefit of those pupils who are interested in music.

The school band also plays at the assemblies, the Annual Athletic Meet, the Annual Prize Distribution function and the school socials.

INDIAN AND WESTERN MUSIC

The Music Group aims at inculcating in the pupils the appreciation of the elementary and fundamental notations of classical Indian music as well as of popular strains in Indian and Western Music.

ELOCUTION

In order to develop oratory abilities, opportunities are provided for exposures through the group. We hold annual elocution competitions.

VISITS AND EXCURSIONS

Regular visits are arranged to places of educational interest like the museum, the

aquarium, the planetarium, the zoo, the mint, the milk colony, the theatre and the cinema for our pupils. These visits form a part of the school's education plan and operation.

Excursions within the country and outside it are a usual feature at HVB. They range from a day to weeks. With these excursions, both local and foreign, the school tries to widen the students' horizon of experiencial learning.

HINDI SAHITYA PARISHAD

The Hindi Sahitya Parishad was inaugurated during the Premchand Centenary Year to foster creative abilities in our national language.

HVB CLUBS

HVB is committed to offering students wide-ranging opportunities for extracurricular participation. The School believes that participation in extracurricular activities enables students to develop talents that may find little expression in the classroom. Club activities expand interactions among students, who are likely to interact with others who are different from them. The following clubs at HVB provide the students with a platform to showcase their talents and make them better in the fields of their passion.

Interact Club, Literary Club – English& Hindi, Math Club, Science club, Nature Club, Quiz Club, Citizenship Club, Media Club, Young Historians Club, Young Astronauts Club, Creative Writing Club – English& Hindi, Personality Development Club, Music Club, Dance Club, Dramatics Club, RSP Club, Sports Clubs: Cricket, Hockey, Football, Skates, Table Tennis, Kabbadi, Kho–Kho, Boxing, Gymnast, Band, & Martial Arts.

THE JUNIOR RED CROSS

The Junior Red Cross is organised for the purpose of inculcating in our children the ideals of peace and the practice of service, especially in relation to the care of their own health and that of others, the understanding and acceptance of civic and human responsibilities and the cultivation and maintenance of a spirit of friendly helpfulness towards other children in all countries.

The aims of the Junior Red Cross are, briefly, the promotion of health, service to the sick, the suffering and the disabled and international friendliness.

INDIAN DANCING

The opportunity of joining these dance classes is provided to the pupils of Stds. III to VII and to the Junior secondary classes on an optional basis.

YOGA

Yoga is a compulsory activity for students from Stds. V to X

TEACHER EDUCATION PROGRAMME

Besides looking to the all-round development of the children under its care, the school does its best to help the professional growth of its teachers and gives them every facility to study further and do experimental and research work in their respective educational fields. It thus helps the staff to keep themselves abreast of the latest developments in the teaching field. In - service training programmes, seminars, and computer training classes are also arranged for the same purpose. Workshops of International Standard are conducted for the teachers.

COUNSELLING SERVICE

The School offers counselling to students and parents. The basic objective of counselling is the overall development of students. Specially it is aimed at helping each individual to gain an insight into the dynamics of his/her behaviour, to prepare alternate action plan for improving on his performance and to achieve his/her set targets and goal. Counsellor are available in the school premises on working day between 9.00 a.m. to 5.00 p.m.

GENERAL RULES

Admissions and Withdrawals

- 1. Pupils who join the school have to produce two Municipal Birth Certificates in support of the date of birth entered in the admission form. The admission of pupils from unrecognised schools shall not be entertained as per school rules.
- Candidates who have attended any recognised school shall not be admitted without a
 Leaving Certificate from the school last attended. If they come from a school outside
 the State of Maharashtra, the Leaving Certificate has to be countersigned by the
 inspector of the division in which the school is situated.
- 3. Admission fees once paid are not refundable.
- 4. Pupils once admitted cannot be withdrawn without a month's notice. Those who leave the school in April must pay their fees for May also.
- 5. Leaving Certificates shall not be issued unless all school dues are paid and all books and articles belonging to the school are returned.
- 6. The Principal reserves the right to suspend or dismiss any pupil if his/her behaviour or progress is unsatisfactory.

Recommendations to Parents

- 1. Parents are requested to co-operate with the school by working side by side with it towards the growth and development of the child.
- 2. Regular hours of study at home help children develop proper study habits.
- 3. The school shall be sending, at regular intervals, messages, notices, reports of midterm tests and exams, performance status, personality traits etc., through the pupils. Parents are requested to look into these and return them promptly, duly signed.
- 4. Private tuitions shall not be encouraged. Private tutors may not be engaged except when the sanction of the Principal is obtained. Special arrangements shall be made to coach a academically weak children and the parents of such pupils shall be expected to share the expenses. The school staff does not take private tuitions.
- Parents are required to seek permission from the Principal before seeing pupils or meeting their teachers during school hours. Parents can meet the staff after school hours or by previous appointment, for which they shall carry with them the interviewing teacher's appointment slip.
- 6. Parents are requested to refrain from seeing the teachers one week before the commencement of the examinations till the results are declared.
- 7. Parents are expected to be very particular to see that their children return home immediately after school hours, except on days when they stay on for co-curricular activities. It may be noted that the responsibility of the school authorities ceases immediately after school hours.
- 8. Any change in the residential address or telephone / mobile number may please be immediately notified to the school authorities.

Rules of Discipline

- 1. On school days and at school functions, the students should wear a clean starched and ironed school uniform as prescribed by school.
 - House T-shirts must be purchased by all students.
 - On all Physical Education and assembly days, all the pupils boys and girls-shall wear black Reebok shoes and the complete sports outfit.
 - It is compulsory for every student to wear the school county cap and T-shirt, as and when required for inter-school competitions or participation.
 - Students are requested to wear only NAVY BLUE sweaters as per school rules No fancy Jackets or multi coloured sweaters will be permitted.
- 2. Pupils are not allowed to wear any ornaments or bring any valuable articles to the school. These shall be confiscated.

- 3. Personal hygiene and cleanliness is laid stress on. Nails and hair should be properly and regularly trimmed as per the directions of the school authorities.
- 4. The school is very particular about its pupils' personal cleanliness and uniform. It reserves the right to check pupils violating the above rules, to confiscate items that do not conform to the set pattern, to take such measures as it thinks fit to enforce the above rules and requirements and to bring the dress and uniform in conformity therewith.
- 5. School Hours:

Primary: 12.30 p.m. to 5.45 p.m.

Jr. Sec.: 7.10 a.m. to 12.20 p.m.

Sr. Sec.: 7.10 a.m. to 1.10 p.m.

- 6. All pupils in the Secondary section must be in school before 7.10 a.m. At the warning bell, at 7.10 a.m., all must take their place in the classrooms or form in for assembly in the hall on the scheduled days.
- 7. No pupil who has been absent from the school or is late for the first period shall be admitted to the class, without the Principal's permission.
- 8. Pupils are responsible to the school authorities for their conduct both in and outside the school. Hence, misbehaviour and/or use of foul language in the school and outside or on roads and in public conveyances is just cause for dismissal.
- Irregular attendance, missing classes and extra classes, unjustified or unexplained absence, habitual idleness, disobedience or objectionable moral influence justify dismissal.
- 10. Any change made in the entries made by staff-members in report-cards and other school records will be dealt with seriously and may amount to even rustication.
- 11. Running, playing or shouting is not allowed.
- 12. When the pupils move along the corridors and when they are on the staircases, they are expected to walk in silence and in single file, keeping to the left.
- 13. Any kind of damage done in the school premises will have to be made good by the pupil concerned.
- 14. Students must not throw pieces of paper, pencil shavings and other wastes in the class or in the corridors. All such material must be deposited in wastebins provided for the purpose.
- 15. All must converse in English in the school premises except during second / third Language classes.
- 16. Children must carry their own dry lunch/tiffin boxes to school. No dabbawala or servants bringing lunch boxes are permitted during lunch breaks.

- 17. The School gives additional academic support to those students who need it. Once the parents are committed to this arrangement, they have to stand by them till the end of the academic year.
- 18. Every pupil should endeavour to keep up the high ranking and good name of the school, by excelling in fine manners and conduct.
- 19. Teachers will be maintaining discipline diary for each child in the class. The students will be awarded positive/negative marks as per their disciplinary performance in class. This will be reflected in the final report card. The promotion of the student may be with held in case the discipline is not up to the mark.

Absence and Leave

- 1. No leave of absence is granted except on previous written application from parents and then too only for serious reasons.
- 2. Absence without leave is liable to punishment.
- 3. The Principal must be informed at once if the pupil is absent from school through due to illness. Wherever a child is absent, even if it is for a day, the entry should be made in the calendar, failing which the child will be sent home. In case the child is sick, the calendar entry is to be supported with a medical certificate. Intimation to the school should be immediate.
- 4. Children suffering from an infectious disease shall not be allowed to attend school. A doctor's certificate that the pupil is free from infection should be sent with him when he begins to attend the school, after such illness, Chickenpox, measles, jaundice, mumps, herpes, etc, require a three week stay at home, since that is the medically prescribed incubation period for these illnesses.
- 5. No leave shall be granted for out of Mumbai weddings, religious festivals, mundan ceremonies, on school working days. If any of these functions is personal and important that the pupil has to be there, then such ceremonies are expected to be fixed up during the school holidays.
- 6. In case of absence without leave, the child, on returning to the school, must have the reason of absence entered and signed by his parent on the leave record. Absence immediately prior to examinations and tests necessitates punishment.
- Absence on the reopening day of the school after the vacations or on the last working day during the school terms renders the pupil's name liable to being struck off the rolls.
- 8. Absence on the opening day of the new academic session is strictly prohibited. Three consecutive days of absence will lead to the student's name being struck off the general register.

Fee Rules

- All fees are to be paid in advance, half yearly or annually by Demand Draft/Pay order cheques only to the IDBI Bank. (The bank official remains present in school premises on ground floor.) Parents who are interested for online payment must enter the transaction number on the pay slip.
- 2. Parents must write the name of the student, Class & division on reverse of the Demand Draft.
- 3. If fees are not paid and the pupil has not been excused by special arrangement, he is liable to be sent home.
- 4. Delay in payment beyond a month renders the name of the pupil liable to being struck off the rolls.
- 5. No deductions shall be made for vacations or for broken periods.

Late Fee

The late fee charges will be levied if fees are not paid in time.

The parents are requested to pay their fees on or before the due date. If there is any genuine problem it should be intimated to the Principal in writing or else from the next day onwards the child will not be allowed to enter the school.

Examination and Promotions

There will be internal regular assessments, projects & tests followed by three terms every year and reports intimating the results of these will be issued to the parents at the end of academic year. The results of each term will be uploaded on the school website Regular class tests shall be administered and parents informed of the child's progress accordingly. These tests will be compulsory and leave of absence from them shall not be granted. They form a necessary part of the consolidated results at the time of the pupil's promotion. 20% of internal assessment (test & project) and 80% of the exam will ensure the child's final promotion.

- 2. Forty percent for Std. IV to VIII and forty-five percent for Std. IX shall be required for promotion to next class.
- 3. We have formative & summative Evaluation : Formative Evaluation will be in the month Mar./Apr./Aug./Sept./Nov./Dec./Jan.Summative Evaluation will be in July/Oct./Feb.
- Any pupil found using unfair means shall be debarred from appearing for the rest of the examination and, consequently, shall be detained in his class and rusticated from the school.
- 5. Application for the verification of marks in special cases will be considered at the discretion of the Principal.
- 6. Promotion of pupils will depend not only on the final report but also on the results of the unit test, the mid-term tests, projects and the progress made throughout the vear.
- 7. If, for a valid and accepted reason, a pupil is not able to appear for a whole or part of an examination, his case will be considered on the strength of the year's record.
- 8. A pupil who fails to be promoted twice will have to discontinue his studies at the school.
- 9. Promotion, once refused, shall under no circumstances be reconsidered.

SCHOOL AWARDS AND PRIZES

Regular attendance, good conduct and persevering application are indispensable conditions for any award or prize.

Prizes are awarded for general proficiency and for proficiency in each and every academic and non-academic subject, the school having a very elaborate and comprehensive scheme.

Awards are made for excellence in the cultural and co-curricular activities of the school.

Best Students from the Primary (Stds. I & II, III & V), the Junior (Stds. VI to VII) and the Senior (Stds. VIII to X) Sections are selected on the basis of their merits in their day-to-day work and conduct.

The 'Best Class Award', instituted in the memory of the late Shri G.D. Gopalka, is given to the class which is adjudged the best in cleanliness, neatness, tidiness, decoration and which is impressive educationally and is collectively smart in turnout.
