

#### **General Rules & Regulations of EOE**

**EOE** is a prestigious **Inter-School Fest** hosted by **HVB Global Academy**, bringing together students from various institutions to showcase their talents across a wide spectrum of events. This celebration of creativity, innovation, and collaboration will take place on the **14th and 15th of October 2025** at the HVB Global Academy campus.

#### **Registration & Entry**

- \* The last date for submitting entry forms is 22nd September 2025.
- \*Each school may submit only one entry per competition per category for restricted competitions.
- \* Schools interested in participating are requested to confirm their participation via email, including the names of all student representatives for the events.
- \* We encourage schools to ensure active participation in all scheduled events.

#### On the Day of the Event

- \* Participants must **report** at the venue at least **30 minutes prior** to the commencement of their event.
- \* School identity card is mandatory for registration.
- \* School uniforms are NOT to be worn during the event.
- \* Each participating school will be assigned a **Unique Identification Code**, which must be used throughout the fest.
- \* Participants must **NOT** disclose the name of their school during any competition or interaction.
  - All official materials provided by the host school will carry the following information:
    - Event Name
    - Participant's Name
    - Unique Code (assigned to the school)
    - Category / Section / Class
    - Date
    - Official EOE Logo / HVB Global Academy Branding

**Note:** Participants and schools are strictly advised not to modify, overwrite, or add any extra markings or decorations on the official materials provided. Any tampering may lead to disqualification or removal of points at the discretion of the organising committee.

# **Project & Performance Guidelines**

- \* Only original, student-executed projects will be accepted.
- \* Any form of plagiarism or unmodified copying from existing models, presentations, or performances will result in immediate disqualification.
- \* External assistance, such as from parents or professionals, must be strictly limited to guidance only.
- \* Participants are required to be present for live demonstrations and Q&A sessions as and when requested.
- \* Participants must strictly adhere to the word limits, time limits, and formatting instructions provided in the respective competition guidelines.





#### **Conduct & Ethics**

- \* Any participant found engaging in misconduct or inappropriate behaviour will be subject to disqualification.
- \* The use of offensive, inappropriate, or discriminatory language or content is strictly prohibited.
- \* The decision of the panel of judges shall be final and binding in all matters.

#### **Recognition & Awards**

- Certificates will be awarded to all participants and winners.
- The following trophies will be awarded:
  - EOE Overall Winner School
  - EOE First Runner-Up
  - EOE Second Runner-Up
- Results will be declared at the conclusion of each competition.
- The Prize Distribution Ceremony for all the events (including athletics) will be held on 15<sup>th</sup> October 2025 at 3:00 PM in the School Auditorium.
